2013 State and National

Legislative Updates

Since the last Capitol Update over three months ago, the Commission on Legislation has been very busy monitoring, and actively participating in, California's budget process, legislative process, and a very active Administrative process. Below please find summaries of how funding will be allocated. For more in-depth information see CSHA Legislation at the CSHA website. We thank our new Legislative Representative, William Barnaby (of Barnaby and Barnaby) for this information.

Education: *K-12* – California schools received an infusion of at least \$3.6 billion in new funding. The Governor's plan to replace many categorical aid programs, with a new "Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF)" prevailed after Brown agreed to increase basic aid for all districts.

Special Education: Another \$2.6 million was approved in funding to fully backfill the (sequestered) loss of federal special education funding authorized under the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA) for services and programs for infants and preschoolers with disabilities in 2013-14. The Governor vetoed \$30 million intended to begin equalizing Special Education Local Program Areas (SELPAs) in 2013-14.

Higher Education: Significant increases also were approved for the University of California (UC), the California State University (CSU) system and California Community Colleges (CCC). In addition, a "Middle-Class Scholarship" proposed by Assembly Speaker John Perez (D-Los Angeles), will offer UC and CSU tuition discounts for students from families earning \$80,000 - \$150,000/year.

Autism Advisory Task Force: Around the time the 2013 CSHA Annual Convention and last Board meeting was held, DMHC (1) issued the Autism Advisory Task Force Report as mandated by SB 946, which can be accessed at: http://healthhelp.ca.gov/dmhc_consumer/br/br_autismtf.aspx, and (2) worked with CSHA and the California Association of Health Plans (CAHP) to solicit CSHA/ASHA input to discuss (a) insurance coverage of speech therapy for diagnoses of autism, (b) current test/baseline measures that are used to determine when speech therapy is medically necessary, and (c) specifically when tests/measures are used in a diagnosis for autism or other development delays.

Working Partnerships with SLPs and Behavior Analysts in the Treatment of Autism: We're All in This Together

James W. Partington, Ph.D., BCBA-D is the director of Behavior Analysts, Inc., and provides services to children and their families. He is a licensed psychologist and has 35 years experience working with children with developmental disabilities. He is internationally recognized as a leader in the field of behavior analysis with expertise in language-based interventions. He is known for his work in teaching parents and professionals about practical, evidence-based procedures necessary for effective educational

interventions. He has been a faculty member of several universities including West Virginia University, University of San Francisco and St. Mary's College. Dr. Partington is a former President of the Northern California Association for Behavior Analysis and has served as a member of the Behavior Analyst Certification Board. He has co-authored the book, Teaching Language to Children with Autism or Other Developmental Disabilities. He is the author of The Assessment of Language and Learning Skills-Revised (The ABLLS®-R) and Capturing the Motivation of Children with Autism. Workshop Description
